

In the past, Thida's husband was the sole provider for their family. To ease their financial burden. Thida decided to start a small rice-selling business. However, as a new entrepreneur, she faced challenges in keeping her business afloat.

In 2019, a friend introduced her to World Vision's microfinance services. With the help of a microsavings programme, Thida was able to kickstart her rice business. That same year, she received her first loan of 400,000 MMK (250 SGD), which allowed her to invest in her rice business.

From there, Thida used her profits to open a grocery store and expand her inventory. She now runs several small enterprises, including selling clothes, firewood, and growing jasmine in her yard.

"With these various small businesses, I can properly support my son's school fees, food, and clothes. I want to send him to a better school for a better education," shared Thida.



Author and artist, Monica Lim, began her sponsorship journey in 2024. She chose to sponsor 6 girls as she recognised that in parts of Asia, girls often face undervaluation and discrimination. They are at greater risk of harmful practices such as child marriage, sexual abuse, and domestic violence.

"While drawing their portraits, I realised how deeply each child is fearfully and wonderfully made by God—I saw them through His eyes," shared Monica.

One of those portraits travelled from Singapore to the hilly outskirts of Mongolia and found its way into the hands of 11-year-old Maral, Monica's sponsored child who had been waiting for a sponsor for 2 years.

"Thank you for drawing me. Your letter made me feel warm and encouraged. I'm sure I'll become a doctor when I grow up. I will study hard," said Maral.

Out-Of-Home Care Children with Special Learning Needs in Singapore

"I feel more confident in class now. I like spelling and want to get better at it. The lessons have been so helpful to me."

These were the words of Alex*, a Primary 5 student who has found new joy in learning through the support of World Vision's One Life Fund Programme. His journey has not been smooth sailing.

He was placed in out-of-home care due to family issues, leaving behind the comfort of home and loved ones. School was also tough. With ADHD and dyslexia, Alex struggled to focus and understand his lessons, often feeling disheartened and overwhelmed.

Hope arrived when Alex was supported by World Vision's One Life Fund in 2023 to attend the learning support programme delivered by Dyslexia Association of Singapore (DAS). Tailored lessons crafted to his learning needs helped him to progress at his own pace.
